The Man Who Knows You

²⁸ Then the woman left her water jar and went back to the city. She said to the people, ²⁹“Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?”

³⁹ Many Samaritans from that city believed in him because of the woman’s testimony, “He told me everything I have ever done.”

⁴⁰ So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. ⁴¹ And many more believed because of his word. ⁴² They said to the woman, “It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the Savior of the world.” -John 4:28-29; 39-42

Jesus cared about people. He cared about people who were like him, and he cared about people who were different from him. Jesus would talk to just about anyone. When Jesus met a Samaritan woman at Jacob’s well, he asked her for a drink of water. She couldn’t believe that a Jewish rabbi would speak to a Samaritan woman, but as they talked the woman began to sense that somehow Jesus knew her. Somehow he knew that she had been married five times. Somehow he knew of her current living situation. This woman was so touched by the way Jesus seemed to know her that she left her water jar at the well and went and told everyone, “Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?”

The conversation Jesus had with this woman changed her life and opened the door for many people in her town to believe in Jesus. Most people who come to faith in Jesus Christ can trace their salvation back to a single, life-changing conversation with a Christian. On Sunday we will continue our **Come and See** sermon series by exploring the way that Jesus knows you and how he invites you to know him too. We’ll also discuss the importance of inviting the people in your life to come and see Jesus so they can find for themselves that Jesus is the Savior of the world.

Our message on Sunday, February 16 will focus on the way a desperate father begged Jesus to come and heal his son who was dying. We’ll talk about our need for healing, and during our worship service we will offer you the opportunity to be anointed with oil for healing. We’ll also discuss the opportunities we have to join in our church’s Care Ministry and how we can offer healing to people in the name of Jesus.

I want to invite you to join us for **Sweetheart Serenades**, a music ministry fundraiser dinner, on Wednesday, February 12 at 6:30 p.m. It will be a lovely evening of great food, fellowship, and beautiful music sung by the members of our Chancel Choir.
