We Are the Church

Now I would remind you, brethren, in what terms I preached to you the gospel, which you received, in which you stand, ² by which you are saved, if you hold it fast - unless you believed in vain. ³ For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. ⁶ Then he appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷ Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. ⁸ Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. -I Corinthians 15:1-8

Hendrik Kraemer was a remarkable lay missionary from the Dutch church. He was in his native Holland when World War II began. The Gestapo dominated the nation of Holland, forcing Dutch Jews to places like Buchenwald and Dachau.

Late one night a group of Dutch laypersons came and said to him, “Dr. Kraemer, what shall we do? Our neighbors are dying. We don’t know what is going to become of us as a nation. Please, please, if you can, tell us what to do. We have got to do something, and we have got to do it now.”

Hendrik Kramer said to them, “I am not going to tell you what to do, but I will tell you who you are. And if you know who you are, then you will know what to do.”

He opened his Bible to I Peter 2:9 and began to read: *“But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.*

Dr. Kraemer closed his Bible. “Do you know who you are?” he asked. “Then you’ll know what to do.” Thanking him, the group left his house. That night, they formed the Dutch Resistance.

We face a similar moment at this point in history. If we know who we are, then we will know what to do. In a world filled with sickness and death, we are the Church. The Church was Jesus’ idea. It belongs to Him, and his Church is the hope of the world.

And so we sing: *I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together!
All who follow Jesus, all around the world! Yes, we’re the church together!*

As we hope for brighter days, I believe Jesus wants to work through the people in His Church to offer hope to people who need hope. This is a critical time for Jesus’ Church to stand up and be the Church. Even as we encounter never-before-seen challenges, Jesus can work through his Church to connect people to God, to each other, to ministry, and to the world.

On Sunday we will begin a new sermon series called **We Are the Church** by turning to Paul’s Letters to the Church at Corinth to explore who we are as the Church and how the Holy Spirit can work through us to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. We’ll explore why the local church is the hope of the world and why being part of this church will bless you and build you up in the days and weeks to come. We will begin by discussing how, as **Easter People**, we find hope in the resurrection of Jesus. I hope you will invite someone to join us for online worship as we continue to celebrate the Good News of Easter. Have a great week.

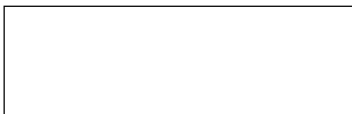
